

Brethren,

Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ!

Has 'COVID Fatigue' caught up with you? The constant threat to life, infection updates and tighter restrictions, as well as an uncertain future, makes everyone uneasy, unsettled, and unhappy. Life's challenges, dangers, difficulties, and trials can knock us off our feet. During trying times, when we sink to our lowest point and become vulnerable, we must recount God's unfailing love and everlasting mercies, as it will serve as a "buffer" to "cushion" us from the "heat and blows" of life. Psalm 91:1-2 is comforting: "He that dwelleth in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the LORD, He is my Refuge and my Fortress: my God; in Him will I trust".

When we find ourselves swirling in the apex of a "horrendous storm," we may behave just like Israel of old making their way from Egypt to the Promised Land. In their challenging and troubling times, their behaviour is traceable in us today. First, we blame God for the circumstances we are in. We question Him as we vent our frustrations and disappointment. We forget who God is and cast doubt on His character and nature. Next, we pick on man! We blame everyone, anyone (except ourselves), for our predicaments.

Brethren, be reminded that just as God was in absolute control of the crisis in Israel, He is in control of every circumstance in our lives today! In God's Sovereign Will and Purpose, He allowed troubling situations to come upon Israel and marvellously delivered His people—so that His power and glory would be evident to the Egyptians, and the "stiffnecked" nation of Israel would grow in their faith and trust in God as they journey to the Promised Land.

Today, you may be going through a situation that pains you much. You may feel lost even as you read the Word of God. After pouring your heart out in prayer to the Lord, you may still rise to your feet feeling restless. The godly counsel and concern of loved ones and caring brethren does not immediately settle your mind and heart. Instead, your spiritual index plunges to a new low!

In our difficult times, <u>Firstly</u>, we need to remind ourselves who our God is - He is on the Throne! God is Unchanging, All-Knowing, All-Powerful, and Omni-Present. He is loving, gracious, merciful, and just. Keeping this truth uppermost in our minds will help us "weather" the harshness of every problematic situation. <u>Secondly</u>, God knows how much we can bear (1 Corinthians 10:13), and He will provide a way out for us. Our faith is forged in the furnace of afflictions - Isaiah 48:10; 1 Peter 1:7.

Brethren, let us recount with grateful hearts the many times when the Lord had been the buffer to protect us from harm and danger (Exodus 14:19-20). Even before a crisis engulfs us, our compassionate Lord commanded His angels to stand buffer for us! God is faithful. Let us not be discouraged, troubled, or fearful. Do not despair! Draw closer to God. God hears our cries, God sees our circumstances, and His ever-present help abides with us. God is our Refuge and Shelter, our Security and Safety. "His (God's) Eye Is On the Sparrow, and I know He watches me" (C.D. Martin). In God, we trust!

Today, we initiate the nomination process where the congregation will prayerfully nominate suitable candidates for elections. Candidates will sign only one nomination form.
