REFORMING OUR SPIRITUAL PRIORITIES

Preacher David Cher, Reformation Sunday, 31 October 2021

Beloved Brethren,
Blessed Reformation Day in the Precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. As we celebrate this Reformation Day that happened more than 500 years ago on 31 October, 1517, we are reminded of the action of Martin Luther when he nailed his Ninety-Five Theses to the door of Wittenberg's Castle Church. The purpose of Martin Luther was to draw the then people's attention back to the simple Gospel of Jesus Christ as highlighted by one of his Ninety-Five Theses: "The Church's true treasure is the gospel of Jesus Christ". The church was in real danger of being distracted from this simple Gospel of Jesus Christ by layer upon layer of tradition, such as the worship and adoration of relics and the giving of penance.

The importance of spiritual vitality.

As we look back and reflect on the efforts of John Wycliffe and Martin Luther, as well as later persons such as John Calvin, John Knox, Philippe Melancthon, and Ulrich Zwingli, let us not rest on our laurels and be satisfied to just going through the motions as we meet. As a living community of God's people, are we truly and surely reflecting the full vitality of our spiritual life from the Living Bread in our lives (cf. John 6:51)? Or is each of us becoming distracted by the things of the world (cf. 1 John 2:15-17) such that we no longer have the full focus and commitment toward fulfilling God's Kingdom Work?

The importance of bearing fruits.

Having our source of spiritual vitality in Christ, we should find ourselves actively reaching out and witnessing to others with the aim of birthing new believers, feeding, nourishing, and helping new believers to grow in their spiritual walk, and

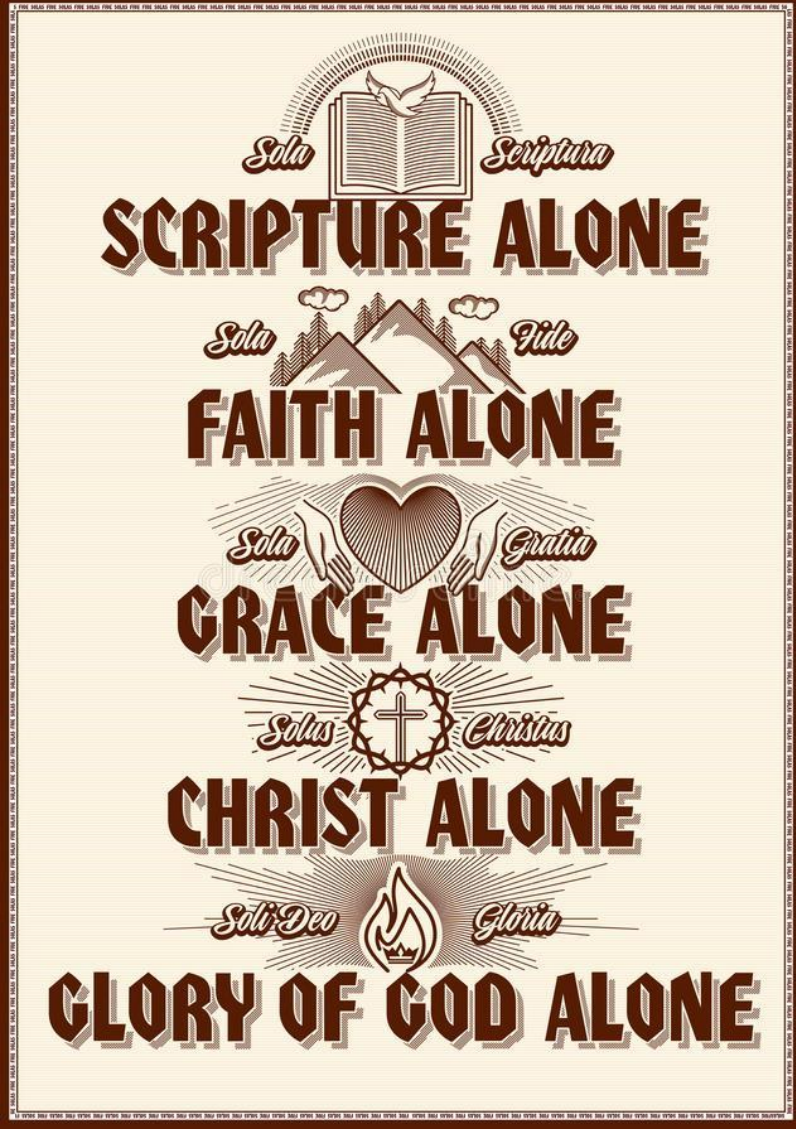
encouraging one another in the church to serve using their respective spiritual gifts and talents to build up the whole Body of Christ. We would also not be tempted and distracted by the attractiveness to measure our successes in church ministry work according to secular and human philosophies and standards rather than God's Word (cf. Col. 2:8). This would ensure that we as a church would continue shining brightly for our Almighty God to the watching world (cf. Matt. 5:13-16).

Throughout the whole process of fruit-bearing, we would also need to be accountable to one another as to how we are walking with God. Using the platform of smaller groups, there can be much more open sharing and prayer than in a larger group. In addition, our blind spots and weaknesses can be honestly and transparently pointed out so that we can work on them.

The importance of spiritual intimacy with God.

No matter how busy we are with God's Kingdom Work and attending to other commitments in life, we should develop and maintain our spiritual intimacy through both the regular attendance of corporate worship services, fellowship groups, and other relevant ministry groups, as well as a committed personal time with our Lord in reading God's Word and prayer. Even Jesus Himself put aside time with His Heavenly Father (Matt. 14:23) on top of ministering to God's people (Luke 4:16). God uses such times to do His refining and shaping Work in our lives (John 17:17 "Sanctify them through Thy Truth: Thy Word is Truth").

Let us ensure that our zeal and passion for our Lord do not subside and grow cold (cf. Romans 12:11).
