

## BEARING FRUIT FOR CHRIST

Preacher David Cher, Lord's Day, 13 Feb 2022

eloved Brethren, Greetings in the Precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. We as followers of Christ are called to bear fruit for Him (John 15:5b "...the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing"; John 15:16 "...that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain..."). Fruit-bearing should thus be an essential characteristic and aspect of our Christian living.

After knowing that we should be bearing fruit for Christ, the next natural question would be "What kind of fruit should we then be bearing for Him?"

First of all, we should be bearing the fruit of our Christian character. Gal. 5:22-23 gives us the different aspects or angles of the fruit of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, longsuffering [patience]. gentleness, goodness, meekness, temperance [self-control]. Having a good and excellent Christian character would then enable us to "walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God" (Col. 1:10).

Secondly, we should also be bearing the fruit of winning souls for Christ (Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15). Together with the intentional verbal sharing of the Gospel would be our Christian witness through our Christian character and walk [conduct], as well as social acts of love such as giving water to the thirsty, showing hospitality to the stranger, clothing the naked, and visiting the sick and the prisoner (Matt. 25:37-39) especially to those who are outside of the Christian faith. All of these would form the holistic proclamation of Let us persevere to have a lifetime of bearing our Gospel message to them.

After knowing that we should be bearing fruit and what kind of fruit to bear for Christ, we would do well to know how we are to sustain and continue to produce lasting fruit for Him (John 15:16).

One, John 15:5 tells us to abide in Christ. To abide in Christ means that we are to have an active and real connection with Christ such that we can draw our spiritual strength and nourishment from Him. We would be willing to allow Christ to work in and through our lives. This is also reflected in our willingness to allow God to mould and shape us, cutting away the superficial areas of our lives such that we can spend more time on God's eternal and spiritual things that matter to Him (Col. 3:1-3).

Two, we are to abide in God's Word and pray to Him (John 15:7 "If ye abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you"). When we have such a focused and prayerful attention on God and His words to put them into practice in our lives, it reflects our humble and submissive heart to Him (James 1:22-25). God would then be able to use us to bear more and more fruit for Him.

Three, we should find our active place in a local community of like-minded believers right here in Galilee Church. This passage of John 15 is addressed to the disciples as a corporate group, and there is the command for them to love one another in John 15:12. Thus, we should also realise our need for mutual encouragement, accountability, and prayer for us to press on in bearing fruit for Him.
