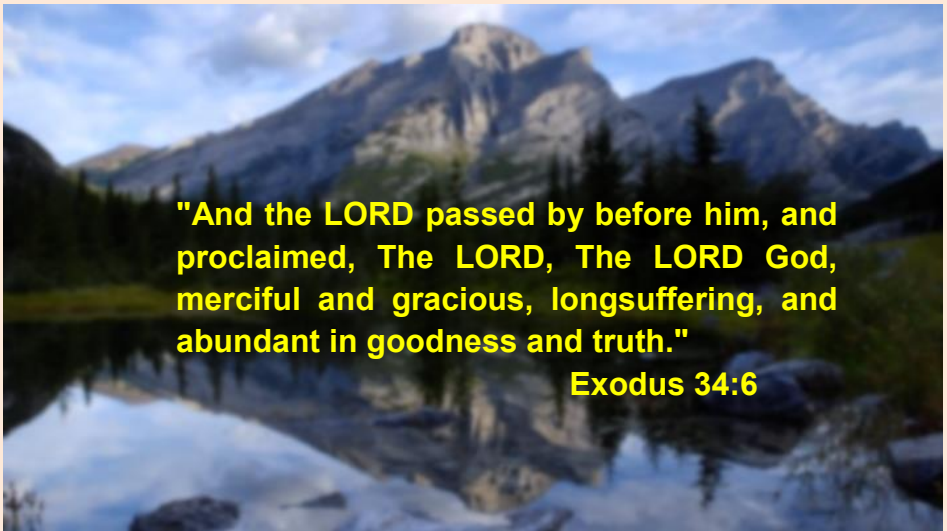

FLYING HIGH FOR GOD

Preacher David Cher, Lord's Day, 24 Apr 2022

Beloved Brethren,
Greetings in the Precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Heb. 12:1 “Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us”. Even as believers, we can be weighed down by such weights (burdens) or sins, and made ineffective for the Kingdom of God.

When we find ourselves in such a spiritually apathetic state, we are to first as what Heb. 12:1 also says to lay or put aside such weights and sins in our lives. We do this by focusing on Christ who would direct all areas of our lives (Heb. 12:2). This reminds us that it is not merely an intellectual agreement of who Christ is in our lives, but referring to a deeper emotional and volitional (our wills) connection with Him.

We are also given the word picture of an eagle flying high in Isaiah 40:31 “But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint”. When the Jews heard this verse, they would immediately remember Ex. 19:4 “Ye have seen what I did unto the Egyptians, and how I bare you on eagles' wings, and brought you unto myself” reminding them of God's care and deliverance from Egypt. God also reminded them as His people, they are to be obedient to His voice (Ex. 19:5). Similarly, we are to also remember God's past faithfulness which would motivate us to remain always obedient to Him.

Before the eagle can soar high into the sky, it needs to wait for the most opportune time to do so. This most opportune time is when

there are thermal air currents. The resulting updrafts can uplift the eagle such that all that it needs to do is to spread its wings to soar up. In such times, the eagle does not need to flap its wings which would require much energy, and it would then be able to last through a rather long journey. What then is this “wind” that would enable us to go through our lives with the ups and downs? This “wind” would be the Holy Spirit. We need to continually depend on the Holy Spirit's leading and guidance in our lives instead of our wisdom and strength. We would then be able to find our rest and trust in God, and let Him carry us through our lives.

We must constantly keep the vision of flying high for God before us, instead of having our minds and hearts bogged down by the circumstances and problems that come into our lives. When we are flying high for God, we would view the different things in our lives not from our earthly perspective, but more from God's heavenly perspective. As a result, we would also be more and more able to rise above the circumstances and problems in our lives, seeing them as much smaller. This process of flying high with God's uplifting strength never stops, and we must always strive to ensure that its effects are seen in our lives, our worship and our service for Him.

As Ira Stanphill wrote this hymn “I don't know about tomorrow. I just live from day to day. I don't borrow from its sunshine, For its skies may turn to gray. I don't worry o'er the future, For I know what Jesus said. And today He walks beside me, For He knows what is ahead. Many things about tomorrow I don't seem to understand. But I know Who holds tomorrow. And I know Who holds my hand”.
