

Haste Not! For The Lord Will Go Before Us

Pastor Simon. N., Lord's Day, 15 May 2022

Brethren,
Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Saviour,
Jesus Christ! We all have our fair share of
"hurriedness" experiences with HASTE. In our hurry,
appointments with people are sometimes forgotten,
items needful for the day are left behind, gates and
cars left unlocked, gas stoves not turned off, taps left
running, lights not switched off... the list goes on.
Carelessness begets dire consequences. Decisions
made and actions taken in haste can be costly, which
we can ill afford. The hectic pace of life, plus our
impatience to get things done quickly, put us
constantly into a haste mode. Brethren, charging
ahead in our own steam creates the hazard of
walking ahead of our Lord.

Listen to the wise counsel from Isaiah 52:12: "For ye shall not go out with haste, nor go by flight: for the LORD will go before you; and the God of Israel will be your reward". I don't believe God wants us to be slow and sluggish. Doing things well to completion, well-paced, with clear purpose and care, is prudent and efficient. It saves time, and we do get more things accomplished well. But when we are in the habit of doing things in haste, we will have to deal with some "trouble down the road". When faced with a challenging situation, we are often tempted to respond hastily, decide/act first, and then seek the Lord in prayer. We need to address this approach.

Brethren, decisions based purely on human perception, instinct and wisdom may seem pragmatic in man's eyes but possibly contrary to the Will of God. Let us cultivate the spiritual discipline to seek God first and be guided by Him in every aspect of life. God's Word exhorts us -- "Trust in the LORD with all thine heart and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy paths" Proverbs 3:5-6.

As we look back into our lives, I believe we can each trace a trail of "debris", the consequences of our hasty decisions. Painful lessons learnt from picking up the debris remind us not to get entrapped into haste again. Do you know that we can be hasty with our words as well?

Proverbs 29:20 is enlightening: "Seest thou a man that

is hasty in his words? There is more hope of a fool than of him". Let's take counsel from God's Word: "Let every man be swift to hear, **slow to speak**, slow to wrath" James 1:19. More often than not, quick, unprocessed, careless, and untimely words have landed us in awful moments, even the pain of a broken relationship. And much effort was required to "fix the damages" to work toward reconciliation.

There was a significant safety concern when God's people prepared to return from exile to Jerusalem. The Prophet Isaiah reminded them not to be fearful or hasty or flee for their lives... but to trust God who would lead them. Brethren, we have all been touched by the grace and faithfulness of God in our life. We have tasted the blessedness of trusting God and abiding in His Word. Be thankful that...

- 1. The Good Shepherd goes ahead of His people. For His Name's sake, He has set the path of righteousness ahead of us. He lovingly tends to His sheep. "He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: He leadeth me beside the still waters" Psalm 23:2. What a perfect picture -- no haste here. As we follow Christ, the Great Shepherd, He gives equanimity, serenity, and peace to every life situation. Thanks be to God!
- 2. The Lord is our rear Guard as well. Vigilance on the fore-front alone isn't sufficient; the rear must be guarded too. Crafty enemies may just launch a surprise attack from our back. We are tenderly "cushioned" in the Lord, who gives us all-around protection and safety. Thanks be to God!
- 3. Thank God for His Abiding Presence. What more can we ask for? What more do we need? It is said: "Safety is not in the absence of danger but in the Presence of the Lord". The Lord will never forsake us (Deuteronomy 31:6). Praise the Lord!

Brethren, we are truly blessed! God, our Heavenly Father, has given us a loving and compassionate Saviour. He watches over and carries us through every life situation. Let us rest and wait on the Lord! God Bless!
