



CULTIVATING YOUR SPIRITUAL HEART

Preacher David Cher, Lord's Day, 11 September 2022

eloved Brethren,
Greetings in the Precious Name of our Lord
and Saviour Jesus Christ. The Apostle Paul
in 1 Tim. 4:8 "For bodily exercise profiteth
little: but godliness is profitable unto all things,
having promise of the life that now is, and of that
which is to come" reminds us of the importance and
priority of cultivating our spiritual hearts.

In today's modern fast-paced world, we are often confronted and distracted by our physical and worldly doings and concerns. We are given this picture of the 4 types of soil in Matt. 13:1-23 – the roadside, the stony soil, the thorns, and the good soil. 1 John 2:15-17 also gives us the 3 things in the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life that have the potential and danger to take us away from doing and fulfilling the Will of God in our lives.

Knowing these distractions and difficulties, we need to keep our disciplined and tenacious focus on cultivating the condition of our spiritual hearts to keep them on-track in our relationship with God. This is then the main role of our personal **spiritual disciplines** such as memorising and having the Word of God in our hearts, meditating and digging deep into God's Word, intimate prayer time, and giving through our sacrificial serving.

One, Ps. 119:11 "Thy Word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee." When we memorise God's Word, our minds would be filled with it, and we would remember it even when we do not have our Bibles with us. Remembering God's Word would encourage and strengthen us, especially during the trying times in our lives.

Two, Joshua 1:8 "This Book of the Law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success." We should be reading,

meditating, asking questions, writing down what we learn, and looking for ways that **His Word** would change and shape our lives.

Three, Phil. 4:6 "Be careful for nothing; but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God." We must make time to be honest with Him, and allow Him to speak to us. We can also come together to share with others to **pray together**. When we go to God in **prayer**, it reflects our humble dependence, trust, and confidence in Him.

Four, 1 Cor. 15:58 "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord." We should be looking out for God-given opportunities to share our time, talents, and blessings that God has given us. Our spiritual gifts must be exercised and practised in ministry and service to stay strong and healthy.

Besides our individual and separate efforts in this area of spiritual disciplines, we would do well in helping and encouraging one another in our commitment to them. This is highlighted for us in the numerous one anothers in the Bible as well as in Eccl. 4:9-12 "Two are better than one: because they have a good reward for their labour. For if they fall, the one will lift up his fellow: but woe to him that is alone when he falleth: for he hath not another to help him up. Again, if two lie together, then they have heat: but how can one be warm alone? And if one prevail against him, two shall withstand him: and a threefold cord is not quickly broken." We are not lone rangers but part of a growing and thriving Community and Body of Christ in this fallen and sinful world.

Let us thus resolve to remain committed to Christ in our dedication, discipline, and diligence that a good soldier, an athlete, and a farmer have as the Apostle Paul presents to us in 2 Tim. 2:1-6.
