



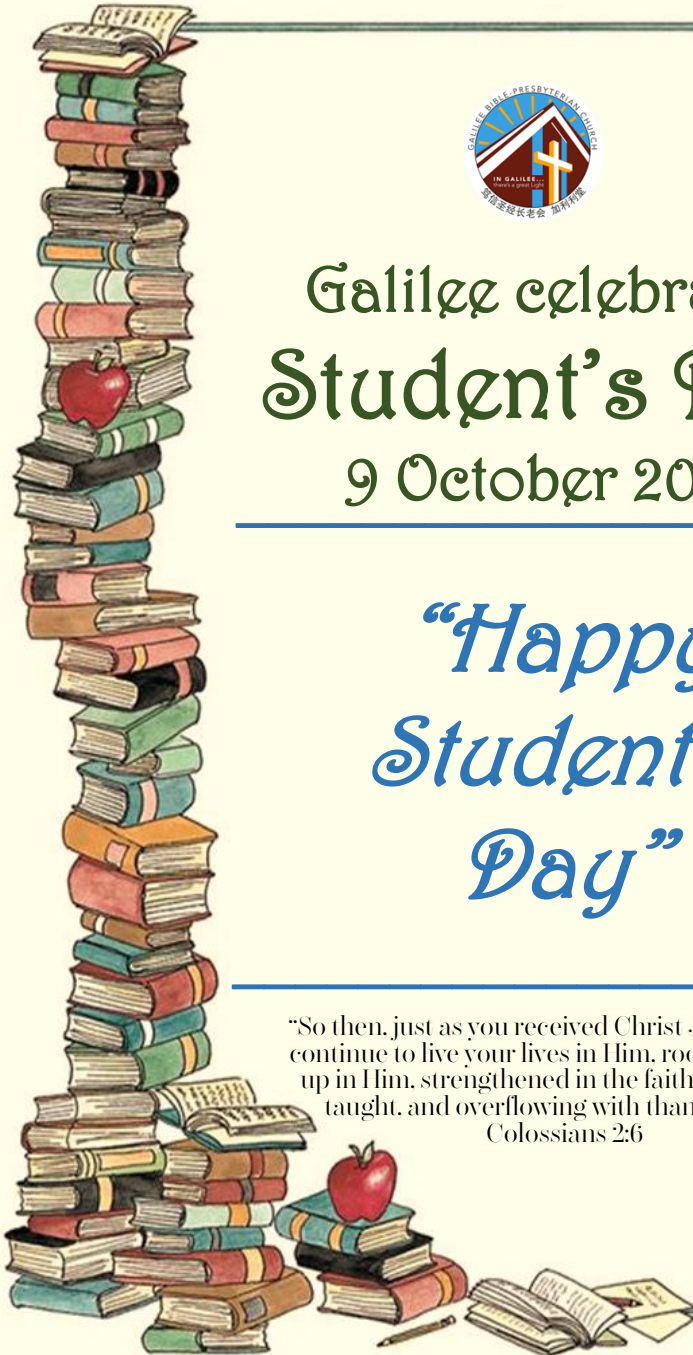

# Being a Spiritual Community in Christ

**B**eloved Brethren,  
Greetings in the Precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. It is truly our Lord's divine plan and purpose, and not by any coincidental accident, that we are placed together into a local spiritual community in Christ. But what does being in such a local community in Christ mean or entail for each of us?

First, we have **one faith, one Lord, and one baptism** (Eph. 4:5-6). This ultimately means that we as individual followers of Christ should and must **keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace** (Eph. 4:3). This is also then reflected in our doctrinal or theological bases, and personal life experiences, that must be all centered in Christ alone (Gal. 1:6-9; 2:15-16). The Puritan theologian Matthew Henry puts it like this: "the one faith is the gospel, containing the doctrine of the Christian faith: or, it is the same grace of faith (our trust in Christ) whereby all Christians are saved".

In comparing the parallel passages of Eph. 5:18-20 and Col. 3:16, we would realise that being **filled with the Spirit** must be equated with **our digging and remaining deep in God's Word**. God Himself is the One who will sustain us when we persevere in relating to and connecting with Him. The Apostle Paul reminds us in 2 Cor. 12:9 "And He [Jesus] said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for My strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me".

Second, being in a local spiritual community would mean that we **respectfully obey and submit to our spiritual leaders whom God has set above us** (Heb. 13:17). This is done with the greater and bigger vision of the spiritual welfare, vitality, and growth of the entire body of believers. When we walk unitedly, shoulder to shoulder with one another (Phil. 1:27), we would not be striving against one another, but for one another for the faith of the Gospel and the Gospel Work. Knowing

this, let us keep all our church leaders, especially our pastors and elders, in prayer as they seek to "feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind" (1 Peter 5:2-3).

Third, each of us has been given certain spiritual gifts for **the edification and growth of the church** (Eph. 4:7-16). As such, we are to walk and serve out of love for one another. In doing so, we would be encouraging (Heb. 10:24-25) and keeping one another from falling into sin and discouragement (Eccl. 4:9-12). This is especially important for each of us, as we are in the Last Days, and could easily be led astray by **the deceitfulness of sin** (Hebrews 3:13 "But exhort one another daily, while it is called To day; lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin") and also **the attractiveness of false teachings** (2 Tim. 4:3 "For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears"). But when we walk together in Christ, we would be able to **stand strong together**.

In summary, we need to have **our hearts still focused and directed toward our spiritual priorities even while we attend to our earthly duties and responsibilities** (Col. 3:2 "Set your affection [minds] on things above, not on things on the earth"). Then, our decisions and directions would reflect Christ and glorify Him in our lives (Col. 3:23 "And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men").

May we, as a spiritual community of Christ-centered believers, press on in our united work for the Lord. Let us not do anything without the Lord's leading and help. Rather, let us be conscientious in seeking God as we serve, with the assurance that He will "establish the work of our hands" (Ps. 90:17). God bless!
