rethren. Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ! I recall being weak in certain subjects during my first two years in secondary school. I vividly remember how the teacher would relentlessly chastise and embarrass me before the whole class at every opportunity and without hesitation. Her caustic words crushed my spirit and killed my self-confidence. I dreaded attending her class. However, my Sec 3 & 4 form teacher was completely different. Her encouraging words healed my broken spirit, restored my confidence, and compelled me to do well; thankfully, I did.

The words spoken from our mouths have more power than we can ever imagine. What we say and how we say it.... can either edify or harm our listeners... to either build them up or tear them to shreds, to spur them on to greater heights in study or service or debilitate and stumble them [even for life]. Seriously, we need to speak with care. The Bible reminds us:

"Pleasant words are as an honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones" (Proverbs 16:24).

Charity [love] begins at home. Within the four walls of our house, how do we speak to our family members? In my observation, kind, good, and gracious words spoken at home promote peace and unity. I admit, we have moments where words come forth like from a fire hydrant, unprocessed, charged with strong emotions that break the decent discourse between people.

The first aid to inflicted verbal injuries is unequivocally apologising to the person concerned. Next, take it to the Lord, confess, and commit to the Lord, seeking His grace not to repeat such unacceptable behaviour—"Set a watch, O Lord, before my mouth; keep the door of my lips." Psalm 141:3. It must not surprise us that there are families where family members don't talk to one another. They go about as strangers in the same house. Such an atmosphere

must not exist in any of our homes. There should always be mutual respect and cordiality towards one another. God help us!

Next is our church family. If we are not kind and encouraging with our words at home, the same will follow us to the church. I have come across on many occasions how brothers and sisters in the Lord lament their hurts suffered by the words of some careless brethren. In response, some withdraw from service and even contemplate leaving the church. These are not hypothetical situations. It has happened before and could happen again. Someone once remarked if you have nothing good to say, say

nothing. Last Monday afternoon, I met a believer who used to worship at Galilee and was on his way to his medical appointment. He spotted me at the church car park and called me. I asked him how things had been, and in that conversation, he mentioned bitterly how he was hurt by careless words by one in this church. Since then, he decided not to come to our church. I prayed with him

Let our speech be sincere rather than pretence, let it be plain rather than vague, let it be inspiring rather than discouraging, and let there be compliments than complaints. The Bible says, "Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers." Ephesians 4:29.

Someone said, "The tongue has no bones but is strong enough to break a heart. So be careful with your words". May the words of our mouth edify, encourage, comfort, strengthen and build up one another, and if need be, to admonish in gentleness and love, to heal and to restore, never to crush or to demolish.
