

# Wisdom Or Foolishness?

Preacher David Cher, Lord's Day, 12 March 2023

eloved Brethren. Greetings in the Precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. In life, we face a myriad of choices to make at every junction. for example, which course or specialisation of studies to take, which job or career path to take on, who to marry, whether to keep our life experiences to ourselves or share with others in the context of mentoring them, what to do with our retirement time, and so on. In making such choices, how do we then know that we are making wise or foolish choices? This is especially needful when we are faced with the conundrum of two "right" decisions, and which one is the more correct one that the Lord wants us to take. In addition, is there only one "correct" path that if we do not manage to discern and decide on it, then we are in danger of missing out on the Lord's best for us?

Prov. 9:10 "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy is understanding." The starting point for us in making wise decisions is first to know God for who He is and submit to and follow Him instead of our own will. Thus, we need to focus on walking in a right and close relationship with God, and seeking His Word and wisdom in making such decisions. It could be that the godly wisdom in these decisions will make us fools in the perspective and eyes of the world (1 Cor. 4:10 "We are fools for Christ's sake, but ye are wise in Christ; we are weak, but ye are strong; ye are honourable, but we are despised"). However, we are reminded from 1 Sam 2:30b that "for them that honour me I will honour. and they that despise me shall be lightly esteemed".

Having a mere deep personal reference in making wise decisions is not in itself sufficient as at times, our sinful and self-centred wishes and interests take over our hearts (Jer. 17:9 "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it?"). We must at the same time also develop as wide a perspective and range of opinions as possible to weigh our direction and

decisions with them (Prov. 15:22 "Without counsel purposes are disappointed: but in the multitude of counsellors they are established").

For this reason, God has for His intention and purposes placed us together in this local community of inter-generational (across the different age groups) and like-minded believers right here in Galilee Church. We are given the example of Rehoboam seeking advice from his peer friends instead of those older than him with deeper, richer and fuller life experiences in 1 Kings 12:1-15, and the resulting loss of the other 10 tribes over to Jeroboam (1 Kings 12:16-24). As such, we who are younger need to have and develop effective mentoring relationships with those of older generations who have walked the paths ahead of us and living and modelling lifestyles marked by the value and priorities of God's kingdom (Matt. 6:33).

For the older generation in our midst, we must guard our hearts against forming and moulding the younger ones into mere clones of ours. We will do well to allow them to develop their unique hue among the ever-changing needs and possibilities of their generation. This is surely what is meant by growing together as a united Body of Christ (Col. 2:19 "And not holding the Head, from which all the body by joints and bands having nourishment ministered, and knit together, increaseth with the increase of God"; also Eph. 2:19-22).

In living lives marked by wisdom and not foolishness, we would be bearing good spiritual fruits (James 3:17-18; Gal. 5:22-23). Let us thus move beyond our self-absorption whether it be like the younger prodigal son who engaged in "riotous [wild] living" (Luke 15:13) or the older self-righteous older son who focused on the mere external actions of obedience (Luke 15:29). Instead, let us have the joy and delight in our Father's overflowing riches (Luke 15:31) such that we are fuelled by our passion for His Kingdom to bring His Gospel into the world (Matt. 28:18-20; Acts 1:8).
