# **TIME FLIES!**

# Pastor Simon, Lord's Day, 21 May 2023

Prethren,
Greetings in the Name of our Precious
Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ!

Indeed, time flies! Our 63rd Church Anniversary is barely a month away, followed by our Annual Church Camp a few weeks later. Praise and thank God for His grace and mercies on all of us. Job observed: "My days are swifter than a weaver's shuttle," Job 7:6. The various situations, events, programs, and occupations, numb our sensitivity to fleeting time. I guess the intensity of our business determines the "speed

of time." Nevertheless, we have to

do well with our time.

They are time, talent and finance. Talents and finance may vary from individual to individual; some are blessed with more, and others, less. But time is a constant. God gives each of us, irrespective of our gender, race and status, the same equal number of hours each day. The question to ask ourselves is how well we have spent our God-given time daily.

We are credited with 86,400 seconds per day. We don't get a single second more. Any second we don't use wisely is gone forever into eternity past. Time has no "carry-over" balance, and it allows no overdraft. There are no "roll-over minutes" for us to fall back on. We can't keep [save] time in a bottle. We can't stop time. There is no going back or drawing against the "tomorrow". We live only in the present, on today's deposit.

Brethren, the clock of life is running fast. You and I are to make the most of the time given to us each day to the glory of God. The brevity and

uncertainty of life prompts the Psalmist to pray: "So teach us [O God] to number our days that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom" Psalm 90:12. Let this be our prayer too.

Making the most of each day does not mean we cram 40 hours of work into 24 hours. Have you come across people who stay up late into the night, then sleep till the last second possible, only to wake up to grab a quick shower, get dressed, jump into the car, shave, touch up make-up at traffic junctions, and even handle a

few calls on the handsfree mobile, all the while driving to work? Cramming as much as possible into 24 hours isn't the way to go. What we need to strive for is work-life balance. There must be a rightful place for God, church ministry, work,

family, friends, rest, recreation and vacation.

Isn't it amazing that our Lord Jesus never seemed in a hurry during His earthly ministry? The crowds and many things needed His attention and time. In obedience to His Father's Will. He accomplished the most critical work in history (redeeming the world). Christ, our Saviour, knew that He had only a brief few years to "finish" His Father's mission for Him, yet He had time to consider the beautiful lilies of the valley and the birds of the air. He had time to put His hands on the little children, bless them, and grace a wedding function. Our Lord exemplified to His Disciples (and to us) how we prioritise our time to the various task and duties God has assigned to us. We should not attempt to divide roles as more or less significant. With God's wisdom, we make the right choices to do the right thing and do it well. Brethren, we need to live a balanced life, a purpose-filled life, a life well-pleasing to God and to the glory of His Holy Name God Bless!
