God Is Our Faithful Shepherd

Preacher David Cher, Lord's Day, 11 June 2023

eloved Brethren,
Greetings in the Precious Name of our Lord
and Saviour Jesus Christ. As individual
Christians or as the Body of Christ, the church, we
should expect to go through the highs [good times]
and the lows [bad times]. This fact of life is
unavoidable. What is much more important is how
we respond to both the highs and lows of life.

During the highs [good times], we would do well not to forget that every gift and blessing in our lives comes from the Almighty, Gracious and Bounteous Hand of God (Philippians 4:19 "But my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus"). As such, we must certainly\ not forget God and think that He is not relevant and active in our lives. During the lows [bad times], we must remember that God is always with us at all times especially during times that we feel stressed. frustrated and think that God does not understand what we are doing through. God's Word encourages us from Deuteronomy 31:6 to "be strong and of a good courage, fear not, nor be afraid of them: for the Lord thy God, He it is that doth go with thee. He will not fail thee, nor forsake thee".

During the lows in our lives, we can also remember and meditate more so on the precious truths from Psalm 23.

First, verse 1 says that "The LORD is my Shepherd; I shall not want". This reminds us of our need to have God as our personal Shepherd, to surrender and allow Him to lead and guide us in all areas of our lives. As we do so, God's comfort for us is that we will not lack anything in our lives. **God always has His best in mind for us.**

Second, as we go through and are burdened by the stresses and pressures of life, there is a need for us to continually find our rest in God as He nourishes and strengthens us. Verse 2 tells us that God provides His sheep with food ("green

pastures"), and water ("still waters"). We are only able to lie down in God's presence when we have peace, complete trust and confidence in Him and His care. This reminds us that we should not thus try to find our trust and significance in any other such us how well we do in our jobs, studies, families, and our service in church than Christ Himself.

Third, it is important how we respond when we fall and go astray from God. Do we remain in that perpetual condition of guilt like a sheep that has fallen onto its back and is unable to regain its own feet, or do we trust God to restore us with His strength? We need to allow God's restoration work to revive our lives so that we would once again get back to walking in "the paths of righteousness" (verse 3) to glorify God and His Name

Fourth, verses 4 and 5 provide us with the comfort and hope that God is still with us even in our darkest moments, and dangerous and threatening circumstances (v. 4b "... the valley of the shadow of death...", v. 5b "... in the presence of mine enemies... "). We are not left alone to struggle by ourselves. We can go through all of life's challenges and be triumphant when we depend on God (v. 5a "... Thou preparest a table before me...", v. 5c "... my cup runneth over...").

Finally, be encouraged that as we follow God faithfully through all the highs and lows in our lives, we would experience God's blessings, goodness and mercy all the days of our lives. This promise of God does not only apply to the mere duration of our earthly life, but also to the most wonderful and blessed eternity future we have in Heaven with God, our Heavenly Father.

Ps 23:6 "Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the House of the Lord for ever."
