

Every Christian A Missionary

Preacher David Cher, Lord's Day, 26 November 2023

eloved Brethren,
Greetings in the Precious Name of our Lord
and Saviour Jesus Christ. Our Christian
faith is not merely existential but also a
missionary one too. What this means is that we are
not to keep our Christian faith to ourselves but to
share it with others of every ethnic (racial) and
socioeconomic group without hesitation and
prejudice.

We often talk about and relate missions to one that is of geographical and vocational sacrifice, that is leaving our home country and job to do the Lord's Work in other countries. But we should realise that all of us as followers of Christ are missionaries for the Kingdom of God. Whether you are a student, a lawyer, a businessperson, a teacher, a mother, or any other vocation, you are called at every moment and opportunity to make disciples as you go through life (Matt. 28:19). The Great Commission in Matt. 28:18-20 is thus a divine mandate given by Christ Himself for all of His followers to advance the Gospel work in the context of their daily lives.

The global scope and reach of the Gospel Work does not mean that we focus all our attention and energy on all our overseas endeavours and mission trips, and neglect our local Christian witness. As such, we are also to be involved in our local church evangelistic partnerships and efforts. In addition, we are all to be active and intentional in using our friendships and social circles to impact and witness to people close to us. Singapore is indeed a global city that draws all other nationalities to work here in the different job sectors. This certainly brings to mind the concept of "missions in reverse" as we observe the diversity of nationalities around and in our neighbourhood.

Not only are we to be aware of Christ's commission given to us, but we also need the power and vision from Him too (Matt. 28:20b "... and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen"; Acts 1:8 "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be

witnesses unto Me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth"). This is surely evident when we look at the contrasting behaviour of the disciples in Acts 1 and 2. In Acts 1, the hearts of the 120 disciples were still gripped with fear and uncertainty, causing them to remain in hiding in an upper room with the doors shut. But in Acts 2, after the coming of the Holy Spirit, the disciples were transformed and empowered to boldly speak forth the Gospel on the Day of Pentecost resulting in the salvation of 3000 persons (Acts 2:41). We would surely need this same degree of courage and divine empowerment for us to carry out this important task of the Gospel work.

What will keep us going in the hard and arduous process of the Gospel work? First, we must be aware that doing the Gospel work would not always be easy and smooth-going. We can encounter cultural differences and friction, persecution and mistreatment, misunderstanding, and rejection by those we are sharing the Gospel to. We should not be discouraged and give up as a result. Second, we are to know that "the harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few" (Matt. 9:37). Having such a vision would remind us of the need that lost people have for the Gospel. This passion and zeal for lost souls should enable us to overcome the personal odds and reluctance that we have in sharing the Gospel with others. Let us be prepared, willing and have the humility to do so.

The phrase "making disciples" also reminds us that we do not stop immediately after people have made the decision to accept Christ. Discipleship is not a moment, but a process by which a person's heart becomes more and more committed to follow the life and example of Jesus, His mission, His values, and His heart. There needs to be a follow-up process of such life training. Such disciples would also make more of such disciples too (2 Tim. 2:2).

Brethren, may we let the Gospel transform the way we think, feel, and choose. God bless!
