Discouraged? Cheer-up In the Lord!

Pastor Simon, Lord's Day, 5 May 2024

Brethren.

Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ! A story was told, once upon a time, a man went to visit the devil's workshop. Once inside, he saw all the tools of evil work laid out on the workbench. They were Envy, Jealousy, Hatred, Malice, Deceit, Sensuality, Pride, Idolatry, Anger, and Lust. However, tucked into a corner was another tool - quite harmless looking, wedge-shaped, but well used. The man asked: "What is this?" The devil promptly replied: "This is Discouragement". The next question came quickly, "And why is it worn much more than the other tools?" "The devil replied "It is more useful to me than all the other tools. I can use this tool to pry open and get into a person's heart and mind easily and finish my work perfectly. And once I get inside. I can use him in whatever way suits me best. It is worn well because I use it on everybody I can, and the best part is that few people even know this tool belongs to me". The man then asked how he could avoid having it used on him. The devil replied, "If I told you that, then I wouldn't be the devil, would 1?"

None of us is immune to discouragement. We have all been discouraged at one time or another. The scary part is that it is recurring ever so often. Being discouraged once does not give us immunity to this debilitating condition. We can get discouraged easily, over and over again. We can even be discouraged, simply by the fact that we are so often and so easily discouraged! Discouragement is "contagious." Easily transferred from one person to another. What causes discouragement? To name but a few: Fatigue, Fear, Failure, Frustration, let-down, disappointment etc. You could easily add to this list.

Brethren, are you discouraged this morning? Do you feel the burdens pressing and the cares distressing? In such moments, one can identify with the feelings of the Psalmist in Psalm 77. He was sorely discouraged on the day of his trouble. In his "downand-out" moments, he was utterly miserable. He felt forgotten and forsaken by God. He was so mentally, emotionally, and physically exhausted and troubled

that he could not speak (v.4). He was depressed and his spirit was so overwhelmed that he even began to question God (vs.7-9). We have all gone down this road before, haven't we? I am sure the Psalmist did not reach this point of despair overnight. Discouragement usually begins subtly with disappointment, which if not addressed quickly, will cause a person to slide into the pit of depression.

However, as the Psalmist cried out to God and searched his own soul, he had a startling insight that saved him from further despair: "This is my infirmity: but I will remember the years of the right Hand of the Most High. I will remember the works of the LORD: surely. I will remember thy wonders of old. I will meditate also of all Thy work and talk of Thy doings" (Ps 77:10-12). He recalled the faithfulness and the greatness of God, shifted focus away from his problems and meditated on God's mighty works, even the redemption of His people. The Psalmist then recognized that the problem was actually with himself, not with God, and his doubts were due to his weaknesses, not God's abandonment. And as gratitude to God welled in his heart, he determined to do something about his problem. Four times in verses 10-12, the Psalmist resolved: "I will". That is significant, but what is more significant is that his four "I will..." encapsulate his firm decision to look up to God and trust in His faithfulness, power and leading and move forward. Will you do the same?

Brethren, we are not helpless victims of our circumstances but victors in Christ. We do not have to be hijacked by our distorted thoughts and emotions. Our faulty thinking and fears depress us. But we can act... as the Psalmist did, by remembering God and calling to mind: "Who is so great a god as our God?" (v.13). God is faithful. He will tenderly hold our hands along life's journey till we reach the "heavenly shores." The Psalmist called to remembrance the wondrous works of God [vs.11-12], gave thanks for God's greatness (vs.13-14) and considered God's past leading and deliverance on His people (vs. 19-20). God's Word is a healing balm to our soul. Cheer-up and press on! God Bless!
