Lord, Posture My Heart!

Pastor Simon, Lord's Day, 6 April 2025

Brethren,
Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus! Next week is Palm Sunday and the week after we will observe Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday and then celebrate Easter. This season is so precious and treasurable for it reminds us of our precious salvation from God's wrath which was made possible through the atoning sacrifice of our Saviour Jesus Christ and His victorious resurrection. Hence, all in Christ have life here and beyond.

Since we came to the Lord, our all-time favourite hymn, is "This world is not my home; I'm just a passing through...". Don't we all sing this celebratory hymn with exuberance and anticipation, looking forward to that Blessed Hope in Christ Jesus? We retire for good from all toilsome labours and the exasperating struggle with sin and its fallouts. Leaving this world behind, to set foot on the celestial floors, in the presence of God is mind-blowing. Furthermore, the reunion with all the saints and loved ones spells joy beyond our imagination.

In this season, it is upon us to prayerfully reflect on the goodness and mercies of God and our Redeemer Jesus Christ. Pondering along the lines of the hymn where the first stanza says, "I gave my life for thee, what has thou given for Me" (The Celebrational Hymn # 675). May our hearts be welled in gratitude and lips laden with thanksgiving—compelling us to serve our Lord diligently.

LOOK UPWARD to God – The Psalmist reaffirmed his trust in God: "Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the Name of the LORD our God" (Ps 20:7). Sometimes our "roof" caves in due to the overwhelming pressures in life – pain and suffering, physical illness, depression, financial woes, grief, worry, frustration, loneliness, temptation... the list goes on. Think back.... amid our struggles -- in whom, or in what, did we place our trust? I'm sure if we had placed our trust absolutely in God, He would have proven Himself faithful. This Psalm of David reminds us of the futility of man when man trusts in himself and the things around him. Brethren, when we

"gasp for breath" amidst the burdens of life, we can look upward to God and depend on Him to help us. He who gave His life to save us from eternal damnation will not fail us in our temporal life's challenges. In God and God alone, we trust.

LOOK INWARD to examine ourselves – The Apostle Paul urged Barnabas: "Let us go again and visit our brethren in every city where we have preached the Word of the Lord and see how they do" (Acts 15:36). Paul wanted to re-visit the Churches they had helped to start and see how the churches were getting along. He was concerned, and rightly so -- Were the brethren continuing steadfast in the Christian faith? Were they growing in the grace and knowledge of our Lord? Were the churches prospering or stagnant? Worse, were they falling away? Brethren, let us lay it to our hearts today not only similar concerns for each other in the family of God but also for ourselves. We must search our hearts, examine our ways and take heed to how matters stand between us personally and God. Let us "see how we are doing" in the Lord and His work.

LOOK FORWARD "for that Blessed Hope, and the glorious Appearing of the Great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ" (Titus 2:13) -- with great anticipation. The Lord's Second Coming is imminent, at any moment. Taking this to heart, we are to live circumspectly, with "an eye on the sky"! Looking forward to that "Blessed Hope" will give us the strength, resilience and power in God to live every day well and make our lives count for Jesus in our earthly journey. Life without Christ leads to a hopeless end, but life in Christ is an endless hope. The greatest joy anyone can get is to know Jesus as Lord and Saviour and have the sure Hope of Heaven! With each passing hour, James 5:8 takes on added significance: "The Coming of the Lord is at hand". Let us not grow weary in sharing the Gospel with our loved ones, friends and others. Let us be occupied in the Lord's service in the local church where the Lord has placed us. Brethren, until the Lord returns, our lives on earth must count for God— "they may rest from their labours, and their works do follow them" Rev 14:13. God Bless!
