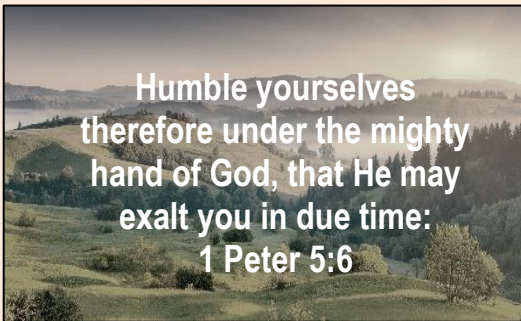

Ordinary Lives, Missional Calling

Rev David Cher, Lord's Day, 24 May 2026

Beloved Brethren,
Greetings in the Precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. "Keep your heart with all vigilance, for from it flow the springs of life" (Proverbs 4:23). In Singapore, life moves fast. Between work deadlines, school runs, and the constant pull to get ahead, it's easy for our hearts to get crowded, guarded, and numb. **And what we allow into that space shapes everything—how we see people, what we care about, and whether we notice the ones right around us who are weary and lost.**

The real question is: what is our involvement in God's mission, and how does that shape the decisions we make at the important, crucial junctions and crossroads of our lives? When mission is peripheral, we choose careers, relationships, and routines based on comfort, status, and security alone. When mission is central, those same choices get weighed against the reality that people are harassed and helpless, to whom Jesus sends His labourers. Our involvement in His work doesn't just add another item to our calendar—it reorients what we say yes and no to where it matters most.

Jesus called the gap between the plentiful harvest and few labourers a crisis, and His response wasn't more programs, but hearts moved by love and compassion for the lost wherever we are. In Matthew 9:36-38, He saw the crowds, had compassion because they were harassed and helpless like sheep without a shepherd, and told His disciples to pray for more labourers. When our hearts are guarded, we categorise people as busy, difficult, or "not our problem". **But when our hearts are aligned with Jesus', we begin to see what He sees—harassment, helplessness, and a real need for a shepherd.** And that kind of seeing changes what we are willing to do.

Right after naming the need, Jesus does not call for professional missionaries only. In Matthew 10:1-5,

He gives authority to the twelve disciples—ordinary men with ordinary backgrounds—and sends them to "the lost sheep of the house of Israel." **The mission starts local, with the people right in front of them.** This matters for us in Singapore.

Our missional presence isn't only about going overseas—it's about being sent to where we already live, work and study. God uses ordinary lives lived with gospel intentionality to reach people who will most likely not walk into a church. That raises a real question: if we are not willing to live out God's mission here at home, where the people, culture, and opportunities are familiar, how can we expect to do it faithfully in other nations overseas? **The question isn't "Am I called?" but "Where has He already placed me, and will I go there with compassion?"**

None of this happens by willpower alone. Jesus also told His disciples to pray for laborers (Matt. 9:38) because the work is too big and our hearts are too slow to care on our own. **Prayer realigns us with His compassion and opens our eyes to opportunities we would miss.** It reminds us we are sent, not self-sent, and that He is already at work in the people around us.

This is how ordinary lives become missional. Not through extraordinary plans, but through eyes that see, hearts that feel, and feet that move where Jesus sends. The call doesn't solely hinge on your credentials or preparation. What it requires is a heart realigned with His and a willingness to go where He sends you today. So look around you and ask: where is He already at work, and will I join Him?

John 20:21 "Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.'"
