Not Alone At The Crossroads

Rev David Cher, Lord's Day, 28 June 2026

Beloved Brethren,
Greetings in the Precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Life is rarely a straight road. More often, it is a series of crossroads — places where the familiar ends and the future is still unwritten. Some crossroads come with noise and urgency, others with quiet unease. Yet every one of them asks the same question: Who will I trust when I cannot see what lies ahead? The Scriptures are full of people at such crossroads, and the God we meet there is never impatient. He meets us with His presence.

A crossroad is rarely just about direction. It is about dependence. At these crossroads, the ground shifts beneath us. The plans we carried no longer fit, and the questions we tried to avoid rise to the surface. Yet it is often here, in the in-between, that God does His deepest work. He uses the uncertainty to draw us closer, to loosen our grip on control, and to remind us that we are not walking alone, but always with Him.

A crossroad has a way of exposing the heart. It **reveals our fear**, with its anxious question, “What if I choose wrong?” — reminding us that God rarely gives a full map, only a lamp for the next step (Ps. 119:105). It **reveals our desire**, asking what we are truly chasing — comfort, approval, safety — for like Solomon, we find every road is “vanity” apart from Him (Eccl. 12:13). And it **reveals our faith**, uncovering whether we lean on our own understanding or trust the Lord to direct our steps (Prov. 3:5-6). A crossroad doesn't create faith; it uncovers it, and points us back to the one question that matters: Will God be enough?

We should be comforted, knowing that God meets us too at these crossroads. He does not stand distant as we wrestle with uncertainty.

He redirects us when we wander — sometimes with a firm hand like He did with Jonah, sometimes with a gentle nudge like He did with Ruth. **He provides for us** when we are lacking — giving peace when our minds are anxious (Phil. 4:6-7), strength when our souls are weary (Isaiah 40:29), and wisdom when we do not know which way to turn (James 1:5). And most of all, **He stays with us**. At a crossroad, the deepest comfort is not the promise that “You will get it right,” but the greater promise that “I will never leave you nor forsake you” (Heb. 13:5). We may not see the whole path, but we are never walking it alone.

This calls for a different kind of walking. It teaches us to **pause before we panic** — to be still long enough to know that He is God (Ps. 46:10), even when we long to rush ahead. It teaches us to **reframe our questions**, from “What should I do?” to “Who is God forming in me here?” And it teaches us to **obey in the small, unseen steps**. We rarely see the whole path ahead, but Scripture reminds us that “a person's steps are established by the Lord” (Ps. 37:23). The next door often opens only after we take the next step in faith.

God's design at a crossroad is also not isolation, but wisdom in community. “Without counsel, plans go awry, but in the multitude of counsellors they are established.” (Prov. 15:22). At a crossroad, we need voices that are rooted in Scripture — friends who will pray with us when we can't pray for ourselves, and people who will gently remind us of God's faithfulness when doubt gets loud. We were never meant to discern our next step in a vacuum. The Lord often clarifies our direction through the counsel, encouragement, and even the questions of others He places beside us.

May the Lord meet you at your crossroads, and walk with you through them. God bless!
