The Church: Blessed to Bless Singapore

Rev David Cher, Lord's Day, 09 August 2026

Beloved Brethren,
“I beg you as sojourners and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the soul, having your conduct honourable among the Gentiles... Honour all people. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honour the king”(1 Peter 2:11-12a, 17).

As we celebrate another National Day, we would do well to first remember who we are: strangers and pilgrims in this world. Singapore is the place God has sovereignly placed us for a time. We are thankful for more than 60 years of peace, progress, and provision. These are gifts of God's common grace. Yet our ultimate citizenship is in heaven (Phil 3:20). That must shape how we live here on earth.

History shows us again and again empires that seemed unshakable have crumbled. Small nations have been preserved. Borders shift, economies fluctuate, leaders come and go. The book of Daniel reminds us that it is God who “removeth kings, and setteth up kings” Dan. 2:21. No nation rises by accident, and no nation falls outside of His sovereignty. For us in Singapore, this means humility. We thank God for more than 60 years of peace and progress, but we do not put our ultimate trust in what we can build with our own hands.

If God holds the nations, then our hearts must be anchored in Him. When our hearts are anchored in Him, the fear of the Lord reorders all our other fears. We do not know what the next 5 or 10 years will bring for Singapore, for our jobs, or for our families. Elections will come and go. Economies will rise and fall. New challenges will appear. But none of it catches God by surprise.

At the same time, our first posture toward government is prayer. We pray not only when we

agree with our leaders, but especially when the decisions are heavy. We pray for wisdom for the Prime Minister and Cabinet, for integrity in Parliament, for justice in our courts, and for strength in our civil service. Honouring authority also means submission. Not blind agreement, but respect, lawfulness, and peace. And it means speaking truth with grace, and without hostility and cynicism when we raise our concerns (Eph. 4:15).

Throughout these more than 60 years, God intends for the church to be a blessing to Singapore. He has given us peace, stability, and provision far beyond what we deserve. National Day reminds us to be grateful, but gratitude must lead to action. God now calls us to give back to the land He has placed us in — by loving our neighbours in our estate, caring for the elderly and the vulnerable, and doing our work and studies with honesty and grace. In doing so, we honour our country and we honour our Heavenly King who put us here for such a time as this.

And God has also sovereignly brought the nations to our doorstep. This is not an accident. In our schools, workplaces, and neighbourhoods, we now live side by side with people from many nations and backgrounds. It is a God-given opportunity. As a church, we are called to love our neighbour and to reach the nations, and in Singapore those two callings meet in the same place. When people see how we serve, how we speak, and how we care across every language and culture, they see something different. May our lives be such that they ask about the hope we have, and may we be ready to point them to Jesus.

May the Lord bless Singapore, and may He use His church here to be a blessing to the nations. To Him be the glory, now and forever. God bless!
