Sheltered to be Strengthened

Rev David Cher, Lord's Day, 27 Sept 2026

Beloved Brethren,
Greetings in the precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Have you ever felt pressed and stressed in a season of struggle? Not just tired but stretched thin - pulled in every direction by needs at home, pressures at work, and burdens in your heart that no one else sees. When such pressures mount, where do you turn for escape and deliverance? We all turn somewhere – some to distraction, some to busyness, some by turning inward and shutting down.

But God reminds us, "He that dwelleth in the secret place of the most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty" (Psalm 91:1). We are to find our permanent home and refuge in Him especially during the storm. When we hear "shadow," we think of Psalm 23:4 — "the valley of the shadow of death" — and feel fear. But the shadow in Psalm 91 is not the shadow of death; it is the shadow of shelter. In scorching heat, it is not something you fear, but something you flee to — the cool refuge under a great tree where the weary soul can rest. This is to be our permanent home in Him, especially in the storm.

This was the reality Joni Eareckson Tada has lived for over 50 years. A diving accident at age 17 left her a quadriplegic. Battle after battle came — chronic pain, cancer, endless physical limitation. Yet her spirit was not shaken. Why? Because the Lord became her dwelling place. As she herself says, "Sometimes God allows what He hates to accomplish what He loves." Even from a wheelchair, she has abided under His shadow.

If God is offering such a refuge, our part is simply to draw near and stay near. Yet that is where many of us falter. Drawing near is not meant to be a Sunday activity, but a daily practice. It is not meant to be a desperate run to God in a crisis,

only to live outside His shadow for the rest of the time. As Charles Spurgeon observed, "Every child of God looks towards the inner sanctuary and the mercy-seat, yet all do not dwell in the most holy place; they run to it at times, and enjoy occasional approaches, but they do not habitually reside in the mysterious presence."

Psalm 91:2 goes on to declare, "I will say of the LORD, He is my refuge and my fortress: my God; in Him will I trust." There is a beautiful difference here. A refuge is where we retreat to be safe; a fortress is where we advance from with strength. In seasons of struggle, we need a refuge — a place to hide, to weep, and to be still. But the Lord does not leave us hiding. He becomes our fortress. He not only gives us rest for our souls but resolve for the battle ahead — strengthening us to step out again in obedience, even beyond our comfort zone.

Do we not see this in young Joshua when he had to take over from Moses after he died and had to lead Israel into a land of giants and walled cities? It surely seems to be an impossible assignment for Joshua. And so God's word to him was, "Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the LORD thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest." (Joshua 1:9) The same Presence that sheltered him emboldened him.

Beloved, let us no longer place our hope in earthly and transitory things — our plans, our goals, our ambitions. Let us seek our peace and security in His shadow and in His protection, and we will know the peace that passes all understanding (Phil. 4:7). Like a tree planted by the waters that spreads out her roots by the river, we shall not fear when heat comes, but our leaf shall be green, and we shall not cease from yielding fruit (Jer. 17:7-8).
